DUTIES: Under the close supervision of a superintendent or designee in a Youth Justice Commission facility, as trainee, assists in providing Cognitive Behavioral Treatment in both individual and group modalities to the young people in the facility; assists with family sessions and psychoeducation to both the youth and the family; assists in completion of reports for parole, probation services, and classification; does related work as required. REQUIREMENTS

<u>NOTE</u>: Applicants must meet one of the following or a combination of both experience and education. Thirty (30) semester hour credits are equal to one (1) year of relevant experience.

Four (4) years of professional experience relevant to the position.

<u>NOTE</u>: Please refer to the Advancement section located at the bottom of this title specification for a comprehensive list of approved journeyman titles connected to this trainee title. Experience must be related to the journeyman title associated with the position.

OR

Possession of a bachelor's degree from an accredited college or university.

<u>NOTE</u>: "Professional experience" refers to work that is analytical, evaluative, and interpretive; requires a range of basic knowledge of the profession's concepts and practices; and is performed with the authority to act and make accurate and informed decisions.

ADVANCEMENT: Appointees who successfully complete the twelve-month training period will be eligible for advancement to the title, Social Worker 2 and Social Worker 2, Corrections in accordance with Department of Personnel procedures. The inability of an employee in this title to attain a level of performance warranting advancement to a title listed above shall be considered as cause for separation.

LICENSE: Appointee will be required to possess a driver's license valid in New Jersey.

<u>RESUME NOTE</u>: Eligibility determinations will be based upon information presented in resume only. Applicants who possess foreign degrees (degrees earned outside of the U.S.) are required to provide an evaluation indicating the U.S. equivalency prior to the closing date. Failure to do so may result in your ineligibility.
